

45-15 Days before expiry date

within 15 days before the due date or not later than 7 days after

Repeat Interval

VISA Extension 1,900 THB fee

Notification of staying in the Kingdom for more than 90 days fill the TM.47 in person or online system*, keep the Receipt of Notification *(online TM.47 available for the 2nd time report onward, keep a confirmation email)

Type of Program



1. Degree Program

Fulltime Student who enrolled at KMUTNB for Diploma, Bachelor, Master or Doctoral degree.

Double/Joint Degree Student who enrolls to double degree program studying at both home university and KMUTNB.

VISA is required

Required: "Non-Immigrant ED or ED+ VISA"

What is Non-Immigrant ED or ED+ VISA?

This type of visa is issued to travelers who wish to enter Thailand for the purpose of studying, attending seminar, training, and internship <u>as compulsory part of curriculum</u>.

2. Non-degree Program

Individual who enrolls in short-term program; student camp, study course, seminar, training, internship or research program.

*(internship or research cannot receive income or salary from enrolled program except from grant and scholarship otherwise work permit and Non-Immigrant B VISA type are needed)

VISA Exemption Scheme (period of stay less than 60 days)

- "THAI 60-Day Visa Exemption" Page 13
- "VISA Exemption Agreement" Page 14

VISA is required (cannot enter via VISA Exemption Scheme)

- Program stated the requirement for Non-Immigrant ED VISA
- Period of stay exceeding 60 days for most countries
- Countries that are not listed on any exemptions
 Required: "Non-Immigrant ED VISA"

IMPORTANT NOTICE

In accordance to Immigration Act, B.E. 2522

- 1. All passengers must complete the Thailand Digital Arrival Card.
- 2. If the alien stays in the Kingdom longer than 90 days, he/she must notify in writing the nearest Immigration Officer, concerning place of stay, as soon as possible upon expiration of 90 days. And required to do so every 90 days.
- 3. Aliens are not allowed to work unless they are granted Work Permit.
- 4. Foreigners are required to submit their arrival card information 3 days in advance of their arrival date in Thailand.

First Entry VISA Stamped "used"



Your VISA before entry

VISA stamped "used" after your entry

VISA or E-VISA issued by Royal Thai Embassy or Consulate-General

means the duration that you can enter Thailand with that VISA

Does not mean expiry date of that VISA after you entering in Thailand

VISA or E-VISA has been used for your entry and is not valid anymore meaning you cannot re-enter Thailand with that VISA.

The expiry date of VISA staying in Thailand will be newly issued to valid for 90 days or less.

If you leave Thailand without Re-entry permit or unless stated in the VISA conditions, your VISA will be voided.


In case of the landlord has never done TM.30 You must ask the landlord to

- 4. Export the approved notification evidence for you





The immigration suggests that you proceed the first time of "Notification of staying in the Kingdom for more than 90 days"

and the first time of "VISA Extension" together by preparing both processes required documents and contact the immigration at the same time via a VISA extension queue.



(which shows detailed information about the applicant's years of education, level of curriculum.)

In the case of requesting permission for the 2nd year onwards, must be presented the educational achievement and the amount of study hours attended.



Purpose:

To maintain your VISA status when leaving Thailand, allowing you to return on the same visa.

Without it, your visa is automatically cancelled upon leaving the country.

Where to apply: at any Thai immigration office or Thai international airport

Leaving without VISA Cancellation

If you forget or intend not to do the VISA Cancellation

For Non-Immigrant ED VISA holder

Your VISA will be voided automatically.

For Non-Immigrant ED+ VISA holder

Your VISA will still intact until the expiry date.

However, if you re-enter Thailand with this VISA with other purposes, you could be charged with holding wrong VISA type.

When the cancellation is completed,

a permission to stay in Thailand will end immediately.

The student must leave Thailand within 24 hrs.



Fines & Illegal Conduct



<u>Page 35</u>



Property owners can be fined for failing to report which may result in charging you instead up to 2,000 THB

You may experience issues with immigration procedures like visa extensions, 90-day reports, and re-entry permits if your TM.30 is not filed correctly.

Late Notification of staying in the Kingdom for more than 90 days

Fine: 2,000 THB for self-reported late filing

Increased Fine: 5,000 THB for caught by authorities

Possible: Visa Complications & Deportation

Late VISA Extension & VISA Overstaying



Fines: 500 Baht per day, up to a maximum of 20,000 THB Bans: Overstaying for more than 90 days can lead to a ban from re-entering Thailand.

The length of the ban varies

(e.g., 1 year for overstaying less than 1 year, 10 years for overstaying more than 1 year)

Immigration Record:

Overstaying can also negatively impact your immigration record, potentially making it difficult to obtain future visas.

Illegal Conduct



Do no attend class for a long period of time

Without an approved Request for Retention of Student Status

The university will announce "Student Status Termination" to the immigration and issue the Request for VISA Cancellation letter to you.

If you decide not to proceed with VISA Cancellation and continue to stay in the country.

You are guilty and could be charged and fined with overstaying and/or illegal staying.

It could lead to deportation and a ban from re-entering Thailand.

Working or Receiving Income without a Work Permit



Working without Work Permit is an illegal practice.

You will be penalized and may require to pay 60,000 THB or get 3 years of imprisonment or both.

Moving out to other places

rather than the notified accommodation without a new notification of residence TM.30

Fine: 5,000 THB, if you are caught

Repeated violations: impact future visa applications or extensions.

It could lead to deportation and a ban from re-entering Thailand.

Translated as "water heart" and is similar to generosity but not limited to material things. The hospitality and helpfulness that Thai people are known for is the signature of naam jai.


MAI PEN RAI

No worries! This phrase encourages you to not get bent out of shape over minor incidents and disappointments in life. You will hear this every day in Thailand!






